LOOKING BACK Look back at your notes from September 9, (D1: God's Transformation of Man). Remind yourself of the different states Christian goes through on his journey to heaven.

Scripture teaches that the regenerate man is in a mixed condition with new affections for God (Romans 5:5), but living in the

same body of flesh. What are some of the benefits of meeting regularly with God in His word and in prayer?

Scripture teaches that progressive sanctification is a collaborative work between God and the redeemed sinner (Philippians 2:12,13). Do you have any questions about this truth? How does this truth encourage you in your pursuit of sanctification?

Consider using part of your daily prayer time to agree with God of His transformation of you.
Agree with God about the kind of person you used to be when you were enslaved to sin. Recall the blindness and hardness of heart that was in you as you consistently trusted in your own self-rule, completely ignorant of the end that was awaiting you. Write out a simple prayer in your own words expressing this:
Agree with God that your position before Him today is only because of His mercy towards you. Thank Jesus for His willingness to suffer in your place on the cross. Write out a simple prayer in your own words expressing this:
Agree with God that you are now free from your former slavery to sin. Ask the Father for wisdom and discernment to continually forsake sin and live a holy life. Write out a simple prayer in your own words expressing this:
