## **Thanatology:** The Believer's Relationship to Death

## Sunday, March 31, 2024

Jesus' curious statements:

John 11:25–26 (NASB95)

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies, and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die. Do you believe this?"

## 1. Unbelievers are dead.

- All are spiritually dead until they are in Christ (Ephesians 2:1-3,5; Colossians 2:13).
- Their works are dead (Hebrews 6:1; Hebrews 9:14).
- Their faith is dead (James 2:17, 26).
- Churchgoers can be dead (1Timothy 5:6).
- Churches can be dead (Revelation 3:1).
- The gospel is preached to the dead (1Peter 4:6).
- Unbelievers do not possess life (1John 3:15; 5:12).
- The dead will be judged (1Peter 4:5; 2Timothy 4:1; Revelation 20:12).
- 2. Unbelievers will die.
  - Romans 5:12, 14
  - Romans 5:21
  - 1Corinthians 15:22
  - Hebrews 9:27
- 3. Unbelievers will die again.
  - Revelation 2:11
  - Revelation 20:6,14
  - Revelation 21:8

- 4. Believers died already.
  - Believers died at conversion (Colossians 3:3).
  - Believers died with Christ (2Timothy 2:11; Philippians 3:10; Romans 6:3, 4, 5, 8).
  - Believers died in relationship to sin (Romans 6:2, 6, 7; 1Peter 2:24).
  - Believers died in relationship to the Law (Romanas 7:4, 6; Galatians 2:19).
  - Believers died in relationship to the world (Galatians 6:14; Colossians 2:20).
  - The old "you" is no more (Galatians 2:20; Galatians 5:24; Romans 6:6; Ephesians 4:22-24; Colossians 3:9-10).
- 5. Eternal life begins at new birth.
  - John 5:24
  - John 8:51
  - Romans 6:4, 5, 8, 11, 13
  - Romans 8:2
  - Colossians 2:12
  - Colossians 3:1
- 6. A believer's life is a kind of death.
  - Death to self is the starting point for following Jesus (Mark 8:34).
  - Considering oneself dead to sin is an ongoing practice (Romans 6:11; Colossians 3:5).
  - Putting to death the deeds of the body identifies one as a child of God (Romans 8:13).
  - Believers are dead to the world in which they live (Galatians 6:14).
  - Believers can find themselves in danger of death because of their loyalty to Christ (2Corinthians 1:9; 2:16; 4:11; 6:9; 11:23; Revelation 2:10).
  - Daily discipleship is one of death-to-self (Luke 9:23).
- 7. Believers still face physical death.

\*except for those who are alive at the rapture! (1Thessalonians 4:13-18; John 14:3; 1Corinthians 15:51-52)

- 8. A believer's death is different.

The language reflects a change in believers' relationship to death:

A believer's physical death can be called "death", being "killed", etc. This often occurs when death is spoken of generally (1Cor 7:9; Php 1:20). This often occurs when martyrdom / persecution are in view (Rev 2:13). Often, a believer's physical death is referred to by "euphemism". "go out of this world" (1Cor 5:10). "sleep" (1Cor 11:30; 15:6,18,20,51; 1Thess 4:13,14,15; 5:10 "surrender my body..." (1Cor 13:3). etc...
