- His heavenly creatures (Gen 19:13; Neh 9:6; Rev 19:10; Matt 4:11; Matt 26:53)
- Fallen spiritual creatures (Job 1; Matt 4:10; Luke 4:41; Rev 20)
- Nations (Gen 11; Is 10:5-19; Is 47, Daniel 11; Acts 17:26; Rev 19:15)
- Individuals (Ex 11:3, Dan; Is 44:28; Acts 2:23; 4:27-28)
- The hardness of the hearts of individuals (Ex 7–11; Deut 2:30; Josh 11:20; John 12:37–40; Jer 17:9–10)
- His people's salvation (Ex 33:19; ls 43:1–3; Eph 1–2; Rom 9)
- His people's lives (Is 43:21; Eph 2:10; the Lord)
