(D1: The Heart) Honoring the Lord in Our Bible Reading

The Wellspring Purpose and Disciplines:

I. Prepare your heart before reading God's word

- 1. Agree with God about His nature
 - God's holiness (Revelation 4:8)
 - God's glory (Psalm 19:1-2)

- 2. Agree with God about His word
 - its sanctifying effect on me (John 17:17)

- 3. Agree with God about your nature
 - my former condition (Ephesians 2:1-3)
 - my current mixed condition (Galatians 5:17; Romans 6:4)
- 4. Agree with God about your purpose for reading His word
 - to bring glory to God (Philippians 1:9-11)
 - to be pleasing to Christ (2 Corinthians 5:9)

II. Use self-control while reading God's word

- 1. Expect a single meaning in a passage
 - clear communication flows out of God's holy character (Isaiah 45:18-19)
 - clear communication is essential for obedience (Deuteronomy 29:29)

2. Hold fast to the normal use of words and language

Literal - use the literal meaning of words and sentences to help you understand what is being said

- John 1:1
- John 1:14
- John 10:9

Grammatical - use rules of grammar to help you understand what is being said

• Ephesians 4:14-16

Historical - use the historical context to help you understand what is being said

- 3. Observe your passage before you interpret it
- 4. Understand the difference between interpretation and application

- 5. Entrust yourself to God's wisdom
 - God's wisdom is above mine (Isaiah 55:8)
- 6. Trust in the sufficiency of God's word
 - God's word is sufficient (2 Peter 1:3)
- 7. Read the full counsel of Scripture
 - 2 Timothy 3:10-17
- 8. Recognize God's purpose in genealogies and records
 - the genealogy of Jesus (Matthew 1:2-16; Luke 3:23-38)
 - the generations of Israel (1 Chronicles 1-8)
